Concept: Believing/belonging

Key Enquiry Question: How important is it for Jewish people to do what God asks them to do?

Learning Objective:

We are learning to understand how celebrating Passover and keeping Kashrut (food laws) help Jews show God they value their special relationship with Him.



Key vocabulary	
Word	Meaning
Kashrut	The dietary laws that Jews are permitted to eat.
Kosher and Treif	Kosher foods are prepared according to the Jewish laws.
Passover	Is a festival celebrating the Israelites freedom
Seder plate	Represents six significant items in relation to the story of Passover.

Sticky Knowledge

Kashrut is the set of Jewish food and dietary laws contained in the Torah.

Kosher foods are fruit, vegetables, animals with split hooves that eat grass, non-birds of prey, fish that have both fins and scales.

Treif are birds of prey, shellfish, pork, must not eat dairy and meat within the same meal.

Passover is a story of how the Israelites become free from Egyptian slavery. God sent the ten plagues to Egypt to convince the king to let them go.

Each food on the Seder plate is symbolic for an aspect of Passover
