Brahman	Hindu's believe this is the one true God.
Oxen	A breed of cow which Hindus won't eat because they believe they are special to Brahman.
Deity	God.
Vedas	Holy books of Hinduism.
Vishnu	The part of Brahman which protects the universe.
Shiva	The part of Brahman that destroyed the world in order to create it.
Devi	The part of Brahman who fights to restore dharma.
Krishna	The part of Brahman who shows compassion and love.
Dharma	The religious law that guides people to how good or bad they should be.

Sticky Knowledge

- Like Christianity, Hinduism has its own holy books known as the Vedas.
- Hindus believe Brahman is the one true God and is represented in oxen.
- Whilst Brahman is one God, he has many different parts which are sometimes spoken about as though there are multiple Gods.
- There are four parts to Brahman: Vishnu, Shiva, Devi and Krishna.
