| Word | Meaning |
|-----------|---|
| Country | A nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory. |
| County | A territorial division of some countries. |
| Map | A diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc. |
| Continent | Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica). |
| Graph | A diagram measured along one of a pair of axes at right angles. |

Cairo is the capital of Egypt.
