Animal skins were used for clothing and bedding.</p> <p>Stonehenge is a famous prehistoric monument in Wiltshire that was built at the end of the Neolithic period.</p> <p>Weapons were crafted from stone, iron and bronze.</p> <p>The Stone Age period is the longest period in the human timeline.</p> <p>The oldest stone tool dates to around 3.3 million years ago.</p>		<p><b><u>A Midsummer Night's Dream</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Context: Tudor explorers.</u></b></p> <p>William Shakespeare was a famous poet, playwright and actor of the Tudor times. He wrote many plays including Romeo and Juliet and A Midsummer Night's Dream which were performed at the Globe Theatre in London.</p> <p>Francis Drake was a British explorer and the first Englishman to sail around the world. He led a number of sea battles against the Spanish.</p> <p>Walter Raleigh was an adventurer and an explorer who lead an expedition to the New World (USA), where he claimed North Carolina and Virginia for England.</p> <p><b>Built upon KS1 explorers and KS2 Viking voyages.</b></p>

<p><b><u>Once upon a time / Journeys</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Context: Trains past and present</u></b></p> <p>Trains used to be run on steam.</p>	<p><b><u>Under the Sea</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Context: Ocean travel.</u></b></p> <p>The Titanic was the biggest ship of its time. It left Southampton on its first voyage in 1912 heading for America. On April 15<sup>th</sup> it hit an iceberg and sank in the Atlantic Ocean. There were only 20 life boats on the ship. Bathing Machines were used so people could change their clothes at the seaside.</p> <p><b>Built on from EYFS Journeys</b></p>		<p><b><u>Global Gardens</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Context: Mayan Civilisations</u></b></p> <p>The Mayans were expert mathematicians and astronomers.</p> <p>They developed the calendar system.</p> <p>The temples were used for ceremonies and to communicate with the Gods.</p> <p>They originated in Central America.</p> <p><b>Built on from KS1 - Monarchy / Castles / Seasons / Space</b></p>		<p><b><u>Romeo and Juliet</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Context: Tudors and Shakespeare</u></b></p> <p>Wealthy Tudors' clothes would be decorated with gold and jewels. Ordinary Tudor houses were made from a framework of wooden beams with wattle and daub (sticks and twigs mixed with clay and dung) attached between the frame. Wealthy Tudor houses were built from bricks in a symmetrical formation. Food was seen as a sign of wealth. William Shakespeare was a famous poet, playwright and actor of the Tudor times. Philip II of Spain sent the Spanish Armada to England in 1588. Shakespeare wrote many plays including Romeo and Juliet and A Midsummer Night's Dream which were performed at the Globe Theatre in London.</p> <p><b>Built on from LKS2 - David Walliams is an author / houses and castles.</b></p>
