Word	Meaning
Prejudice	Preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience
Citizen	Someone who is a citizen of a particular country is legally accepted as belonging to that country
Persecution	Hostility and ill-treatment, especially because of race or political or religious beliefs.
Collaboration	The action of working with someone to produce something
