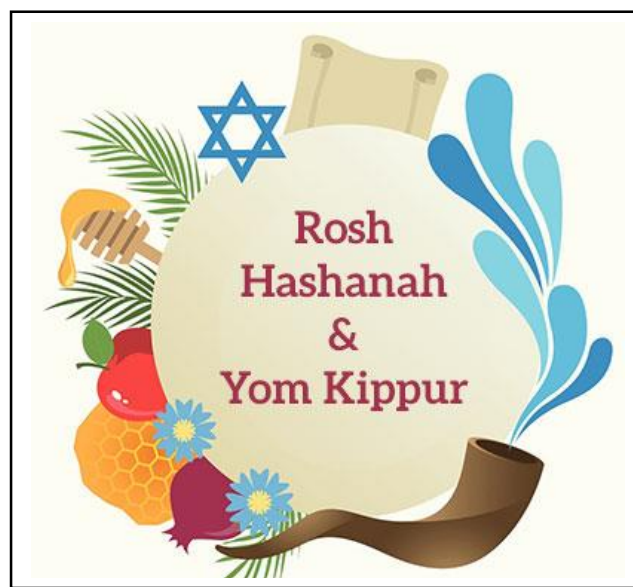
Term 6 – Year 1 – Judaism

Theme: Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur

Key Enquiry Question: Are Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur important to Jewish children?

Learning Objective:

We are learning to empathise with Jewish children by understanding what Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur mean to them.



Key vocabulary	
Word	Meaning
Rosh Hashanah	'beginning of the year' Jewish New Year
Yom Kippur	Day of Atonement. The holiest day of the year. Day to ask forgiveness and reflect
Shofar	Ancient musical horn made of ram's horn (or other Kosher animal)

Sticky Knowledge

Jews make plans for things they want to achieve in the coming year

Jews spend 10 days (between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur) thinking about the last year and what they may still need to ask forgiveness for and people they may need to forgive

At Yom Kippur Jews wear white, have no food or drink for 25 hours (if over 13 years old) and attend 5 services in a synagogue
