Use thick and thin brushes

Mix primary colours to make secondary.

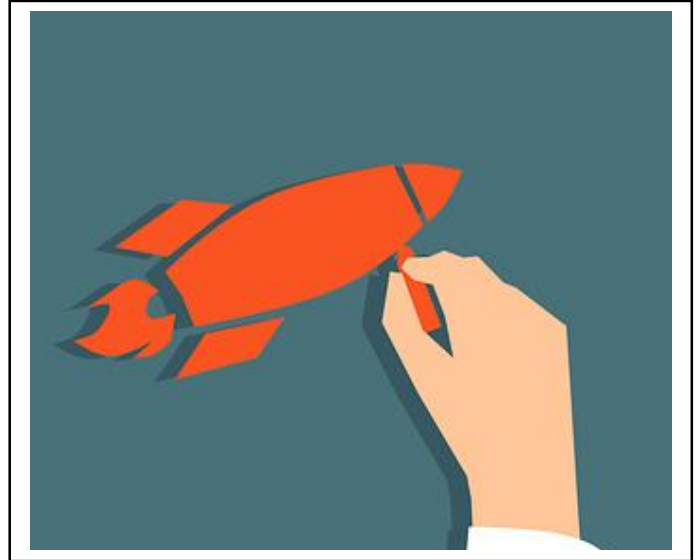
Add white to colours to make tints and black to colours to make tones.

Control the amount of water on the brush to create transparent and opaque colours

Create colour wheels.

#### **Digital media**

Use a wide range of tools to create different textures, lines, tones, colours and shapes.



#### **Key vocabulary**

Word	Meaning
Primary colour	Basic colours that can be mixed together (red, yellow and blue).
Secondary colour	Colours made by mixing primary colours (green, orange, purple, pink etc.)
Transparent	Light can completely pass through it.
Texture	How something feels when it is touched.
Tones	The lightness or darkness of something.

#### **Sticky Knowledge:**

Peter Thorpe is an abstract artist.

Abstract art uses shape, colour and lines to create a picture.

Primary Colours are red, yellow and blue. These can be mixed to make secondary colours.

Tone is the lightness or darkness of a colour.
