Key Focus: How pencils can create different textures and lines.

Term 1

National Curriculum Objectives:

To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

About the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the similarities and differences between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Drawing -Draw lines of different sizes and thickness using a range of drawing/sketching pencils
Colour own work neatly following the lines.
Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines.
Show different tones by using coloured pencils.

Printing

Use repeating or overlapping shapes.
Mimic print from the environment (e.g. wallpapers).
Use objects to create prints (e.g. fruit, vegetables or sponges).
Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.

Word	Meaning
Thickness	The width of a line.
Sketch	A pencil drawing.
Repeating Pattern	Something happening again and again.
Texture	How something feels when it is touched.

Sticky Knowledge:

Different types of pencils make different sized lines.

Sketching is drawing lightly with a pencil.

Dots and lines can create different textures.

Objects can be used to create repeating patterns.

Printing is where colour is placed onto paper using an object.
