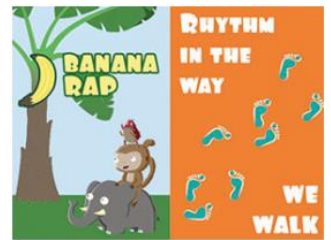


KS1 Music Knowledge Organiser: Rhythm In The Way We Walk and Banana Rap

Key Enquiry Question: To explore the songs Rhythm In The Way We Walk and Banana Rap by Joanna Mangona and Jane Sebba

National Curriculum Objectives:

- ★ use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes play tuned and untuned instruments musically
- ★ listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
- ★ experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.



Key vocabulary

Word	Meaning
pulse	The heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music.
rhythm	The combination of long and short sounds to make patterns.
pitch	The range of high and low sounds.
rap	A vocal technique in which the performer speaks rhythmically against a steady beat.
trumpet	A trumpet is a musical instrument of the brass family which plays quite high notes.
saxophone	The saxophone or sax is a member of the woodwind family, usually made of brass and played with a single-reed mouthpiece like the clarinet.
perform	Singing and playing instruments for others to hear
melody	Another name for tune
singers	One who sings is called a singer or vocalist. Singers perform music that can be sung either with or without accompaniment by musical instruments.
Keyboard	An electric instrument played like the piano. It has a range of pre-recorded sounds.
Bass	a tone of low pitch
Guitar	The guitar is a stringed instrument that makes music from the vibrations of strings.
Percussion	Percussion instruments are musical instruments that generally. are used to establish rhythm. Percussion instruments make a sound when they are struck, shaken, scraped, plucked, or rubbed.

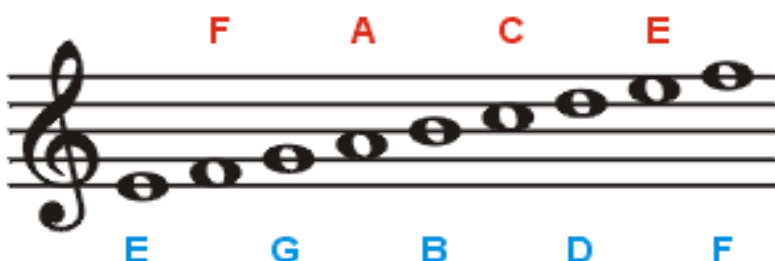
Rhythm In The Way We Walk (Reggae style)

Reggae music began in Jamaica and became popular in the late 1960s. Reggae songs are often about love, religion and social issues. Examples include Three Little Birds by Bob Marley and I Can See Clearly Now by Johnny Nash.

Banana Rap (Hip Hop style)

Hip hop began in America in the 1970s. Hip Hop has now become one of the most popular genres of music in the world, often featuring rapping from many different languages and influences from many walks of life. Examples include Can't take my eyes off of you by Lauren Hill and Empire State of Mind by Alicia Keys & Jay-Z.
