

KS1 Music Knowledge Organiser: Hands, feet, heart

Key Enquiry Question: To explore the song hands, feet, heart by Joanna Mangona, a song that celebrates South African music

National Curriculum Objectives:

- ★ use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes play tuned and untuned instruments musically
- ★ listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
- ★ experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.



Key vocabulary

Word	Meaning
pulse	The heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music.
rhythm	The combination of long and short sounds to make patterns.
pitch	The range of high and low sounds.
tempo	An Italian word used to describe how fast/slow the music goes.
Keyboard	An electric instrument played like the piano. It has a range of pre-recorded sounds.
drums	A drum is a percussion instrument, which means it makes a noise by being hit.
bass	a tone of low pitch
electric guitar	a guitar that requires a speaker in order to be heard at typical performance volumes, unlike a standard acoustic guitar
saxophone	The saxophone or sax is a member of the woodwind family, usually made of brass and played with a single-reed mouthpiece like the clarinet.
compose	Create and develop musical ideas
perform	Singing and playing instruments for others to hear
audience	a group that listens or watches (as at a play or concert)
melody	Another name for tune
improvise	To make up a tune and play it on the spot. There is an assumption that it can never be recreated.
dynamics	How loud or quiet the music is.
trumpet	a brass instrument used mainly in Classical music and jazz music.
question and answer/ call and response	someone sings or plays a phrase of music and someone else (or a group of people) respond

Sticky knowledge:

- ★ South Africa is the southernmost country on the African continent.
- ★ South Africa shares borders with six countries: Namibia, Botswana and Zimbabwe in the North, and Mozambique in the East, as well as with Eswatini and Lesotho.
- ★ It takes a 12-hour flight from London/England to fly to Johannesburg in South Africa
- ★ In South Africa, the Atlantic Ocean and the Indian Ocean meet off the Southern Cape coast.
- ★ There are 12 official languages: isiZulu, Afrikaans, English, isiXhosa, siSwati, Sesotho, Xitsonga, Sepedi, isiNdebele, Setswana, Tshivenda, sign language
