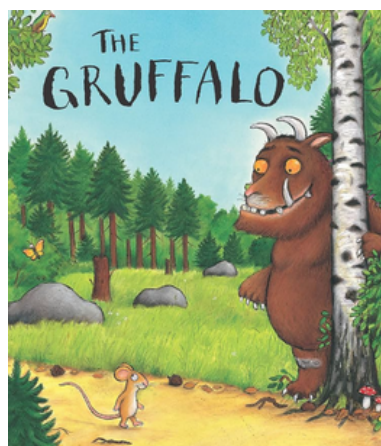
Thank You to Our Families

Learning at Ludgershall

In the final weeks of term, our children have continued to engage in exciting learning across the school:

EYFS: This term EYFS topic has been journeys, this has been a fun topic where we have explored different stories based around journeys such as The Gruffalo, Lost and Found and The Train Ride. This topic has helped the children understand more about journeys and how they will be going on their own journey as they move up to year 1. We have also had lots of fun exploring old cartoons such as Road Runner, The Pink Panther and Fraggles in our drawing club which the children have loved! I wonder which one was their favourite?



KS1: Year 1 & 2 have been learning about the Victorians and exploring what life was like during this period. In Design and Technology, the children have been building bridges, focusing on creating stable and strong structures. In Science, they have been classifying animals according to their diets, identifying herbivores, omnivores and carnivores. In English, the children have enjoyed studying I Want My Hat Back and have used it as inspiration to write their own imaginative stories.

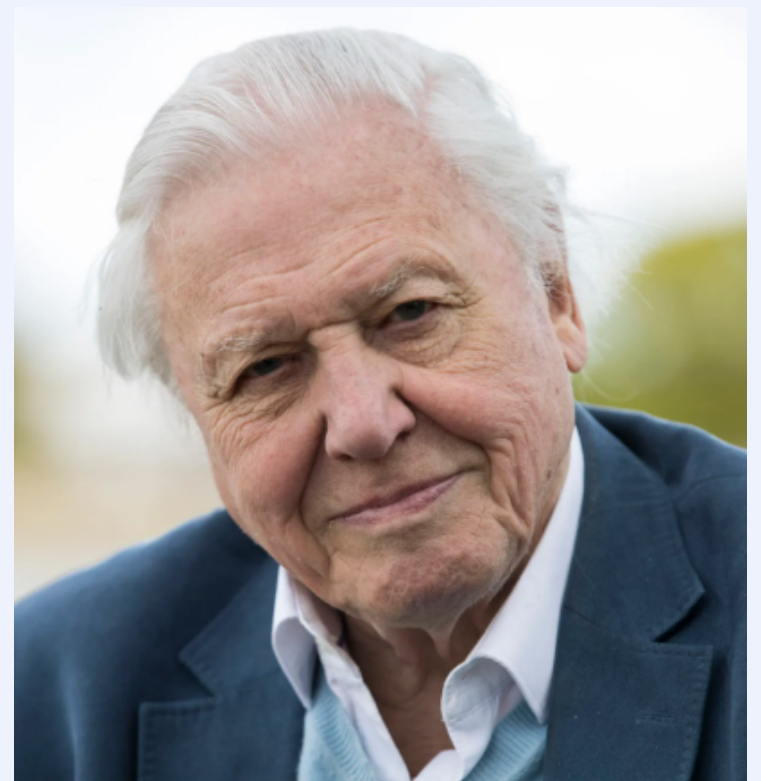


Learning at Ludgershall

LKS2: Year 3 & 4 have enjoyed an exciting journey back in time as we explored the Stone Age. In English, Year 4 have been reading *Stuck in the Stone Age*, while Year 3 have been captivated by *The Iron Man*. Our History and Geography lessons have focused on Stonehenge and other fascinating Neolithic landmarks across Europe, helping us to understand what life was like thousands of years ago. In Art, we created our own cave paintings inspired by prehistoric artists, and in Design and Technology we designed and built roundhouses, developing practical skills such as weaving. In Science, we investigated different types of bridges and discussed which materials would be the strongest and most suitable for building them.



UKS2: In English, we have completed an instruction text, setting description and character description based on the poem *Our Tower*. The children produced some exceptional pieces of work, applying the skills they have learnt. In Science, we have been learning about famous inventors and scientists, such as Richard Attenborough and Stephen Hawking, and their contributions to their fields of expertise. During DT, we designed a cupcake based on *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. We researched ingredients and quantities before bringing our ideas to life. In Geography, we learnt about the major differences between North and South America, including biomes, climates and time zones. The children used atlases to locate countries using lines of longitude and latitude.





Sports Mornings

A huge thank you to all the parents and families who were able to join us for our Sports Mornings on 7th and 8th July.

It was wonderful to see so many supporters cheering on the children as they took part in a range of events and races. We were incredibly proud of every pupil, who showed great enthusiasm, determination and sportsmanship throughout the mornings.

The children had a fantastic time challenging themselves, trying their very best and celebrating each other's successes. Thank you for helping to make the events such an enjoyable and memorable experience for everyone involved.



Well Done Year 5 & 6

A huge well done to our Year 5 and 6 pupils for their fantastic performance of A Midsummer Night's Dream.

You all worked incredibly hard, and it truly showed. Your acting was brilliant, your speaking was clear and confident, and your singing was beautiful.



CSI Investigation

On Tuesday 30th June the UKS2 children took part in CSI (Crime Scene Investigation) workshop. All pupils learnt to use magnetic powder to identify and recover latent marks and fingerprints. They also investigated Footwear Analysis, where they used footwear lifters to recover their own footwear impression. All pupils analysed their hair under a microscope as well as clothing fibres, the workshop also introduced the Criminal Justice System and how Forensic evidence is used in a court of law. In the afternoon session the children donned their SOCO suits, gloves, masks and overshoes and were given their CSI SOCO cases containing authentic CSI equipment. Using the skills gained from the morning session, pupils were then required to work within their teams to retrieve, preserve and document any evidence from their individual crime scenes. Once pupils had retrieved their evidence, they then had to examine the victim profile to determine the cause of death and review the suspect profiles to try to identify the perpetrator. It was a great workshop that was enjoyed by all!
